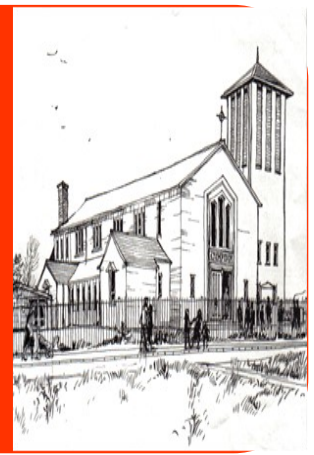

Welcome to Bishop Robert Byrne who has been appointed the new Bishop of the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle.. He is currently an Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Birmingham. Born in Manchester in September 1956, Bishop Byrne entered Birmingham Oratory in 1980 and was ordained to the priesthood in January 1985. In 1990, he was part of a group from Birmingham who moved to St Aloysius parish, Oxford, to found what was to become the Oxford Oratory in 1993. He served as Provost from 1993 -2011. In 2012, Fr Byrne was appointed Secretary to the Bishops' Conference Department of Dialogue and Unity having served as a prison chaplain for over 35 years. Bishop Byrne was Ordained an Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Birmingham in St Chad's Cathedral on 13 May 2014. On Monday, 4 February, Pope Francis announced that Bishop Byrne would serve as the fourteenth Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle.

Next Sunday is Racial Justice Sunday and the theme is "It's not just Work—Dignity for All workers". We are called to ensure people are not exploited while they work: the Gospel demands that we acknowledge the dignity of the human person, the necessity of building peace, prosperity, and justice for all. We will hold a retiring collection next weekend to support the promotion of Racial justice in our world.

Reading the newsletter this week I am struck by the opportunities that are available to all of us to bring about change in our world in a way which requires no financial commitment from us. What other people and voluntary organisations really need is our time—the most valuable resource we can gift. Of course it is not only outside agencies which need our time, our own communities do too if they are to survive in to the future. With Lent just around the corner perhaps you can begin thinking and planning how you can give up some of your time and gift it in order to improve the lives of those around you.
